for Scotland's mental health





Celebrations are in order for Scotland's leading mental health charity, as SAMH marks a milestone 100 years of service. SAMH is encouraging us all to get involved and make this year about Scotland's mental health.

Tracing its roots back to 1923, SAMH was founded thanks to the pioneering work of Dr Kate Fraser CBE, at a time when women were expected to remain in the home and mentally ill people were routinely shut away in workhouses or prisons. Now, the charity employs around 550 staff and operates more than 70 services in communities across Scotland.

This includes services like The Foundry, which assists people in the recovery process and in moving away from backgrounds related to drug and alcohol problems. The Foundry team support adults living in the East Dunbartonshire area who have been referred by local community addiction service. Its programme focuses on helping people to stabilise or maintain abstinence from their previous addictive behaviour and includes a combination of group-based activities and complementary individual support.
